This conference/workshop is part of the project New findings on early (until 1950) informal exchange and personal relations between Koreans and citizens of either the Austrian-Hungarian monarchy or its successor-states

The eventual outcome of the project will be a carefully edited volume containing the revised papers and articles of the contributors. Publication is scheduled for mid of 2012.

### Our new findings are:

- "new" materials like unpublished letters, photographs from private albums, unpublished manuscripts, scattered reminiscences, practically "unknown" publications etc.
- any relevant detail and relevant special knowledge
- new (or first) interpretations of materials
- new syntheses of little known facts

A working blog (only accessibly for the public after the project-period is completed) set up by part of the contributors has, until now, hundreds of entries on more than 50 persons.
