# AYSE CAGLAR

has been professor at the Department of Social and Cultural Anthropology since 2011. Before joining the University of Vienna, she was university professor at the Department of Sociology and Social Anthropology at the Central European University, Budapest and research group director at the Max Planck Institute for the Study of Ethnic and Religious Diversity, Göttingen.

She received her BA in sociology (Bogazici University, Istanbul), MA and PhD in anthropology (McGill University, Montreal) and completed her habiliation both in anthropology and sociology (Free University, Berlin). She was guest professor and researcher in several European higher education institutions, e.g. University of Zürich, Institute for Advanced Studies (Vienna), Max Planck Institute for Social Anthropology (Halle), UIE (Florence, Jean Monnet fellow). She is a member of the Academia Europaea and was one of the vice-presidents of the International Institute of Sociology.

Research areas: Globalisation and transnationalisation processes, migration, transformation of nation states & state spatiality, neoliberal urban restructuring, citizenship, cultural industries & European cultural policies, transnational legal spaces & family law, Roma in Europe.
